
Futurescapes'16 Recap





- Futurescapes'16 was conducted last year on the eve of Children's Day across all JSW schools



Theme Brief and Execution Plan

Theme 1: My Favourite Festival

JSW A

Primary: Class 3-5

<u>Brief</u>

Festivals are occasions for celebrations and coming together. It will be interesting to see children's colourful expression of innovative ways of decorating different festivals .



Theme 2: My Favourite Holiday/Vacation

JSW A

Secondary : Class 6-8

<u>Brief</u>

Every child has fond memories of visiting places during their vacations. Let children paint the picture of their favourite holiday/vacation or picnic. It will be interesting to see the expression of their fond memories in colours.



Theme 3: My Favourite colours



Primary: Class 9-12

<u>Brief</u>

Each Child has his/her favourite set of colours let them express these colours, in their best imaginative manner /style. Colours which they would want to use to decorate wall, toys, scenery, or anything in the world. This will help us draw references on the colours combination, texture art etc.





Execution plan for Painting Competition



1) Readiness/preparation before the competition

- Finalise the date of competition and share the same with us along with number of participants in each segment.
- Respective school to announce the competition theme and align respective class/art teacher.
- School to print and install the poster locally for the competition communication (Artwork of which will be sent to the schools on 6th November 2017).
- Schools to arrange A3 size white drawing sheet for each students.
- Students to get their own colour sets.

Execution plan for Painting Competition



2) On the day of painting competition

- School to decide on the competition timing and venue
- Duration of painting competition is 3 hrs
- Student to write their name, roll number, school and class at the back of the sheet and Teacher to ensure at the time of submission
- School to click minimum 3 pictures of each class, during the competition

Execution plan for Painting Competition <u>3) Post competition</u>



- Each school to shortlist top 10 painting from each class segment (total 30), of all the participants except Vidyanagar and Shankarhill to shortlist 30 (total 90 since the strength of students is high).
- School to ensure respective school name and address is mentioned while couriering to centre
- School to courier all shortlisted paintings to JSW centre in the name of

"Tushar Saxena JSW Paints Marketing team 3RD Floor"

- Ensure that the shortlisted entries reach at the above address (within 10 days of completion but not later than 25th November 17)
- All the shortlist entries will be sent back to the school for organising a exhibition at the Club house of the location
- The winners to be felicitated during the Annual day of the respective school



Group Activity: Go Green

Theme Brief and execution plan

Go Green Group activity brief

Class 6-12

<u>Brief</u>

With initiative such as "Swachh Bharat" it is important teach the kids young and create awareness on subject of go green which is caring and protecting the environment for a better world tomorrow. The group activity is to reuse discarded domestic items and convert into art. Some ideas for reference are shown as below

1. Reuse of Electronic CD





2. Reuse of plastic material





Execution plan for Group activity – Go Green



1) Readiness/preparation

- Student from class 6-12 will participate in this competition and will be a 5 days activity
- School to make 5 groups of 5 students each
- The school to identify and select students for the groups from different classes with the help of the Art/craft teacher basis their creative art ability
- School to ensure there is a proper mix of student in each group to maintain uniformity
- Each group to identify different discarded domestic material, think of a recycle idea and create
- Each group to unite in the school and create the art within these 5 days
- Students to get their own material

Execution plan for Group activity – Go Green



2) On the day of competition

- Each group to submit the project on the day of the Painting Competition
- Each group needs to present the project on various aspects such as choosing of material and the creative idea.
- At the time of submission of their work teacher to ensure each group also submits names, roll numbers, school and class of all the participants.

Execution plan for Group activity – Go Green



3) Post activity

- Each school to shortlist the best two projects out of the five projects
- The assessment should be on identification of material, recycle idea, creativity, relevance of use and final overall look of the project.
- School to send the shortlisted group work to JSW centre with all details like School name, Participants name, class and a roll number addressed to "Tushar Saxena JSW Paints Marketing team 3rd Floor"
